

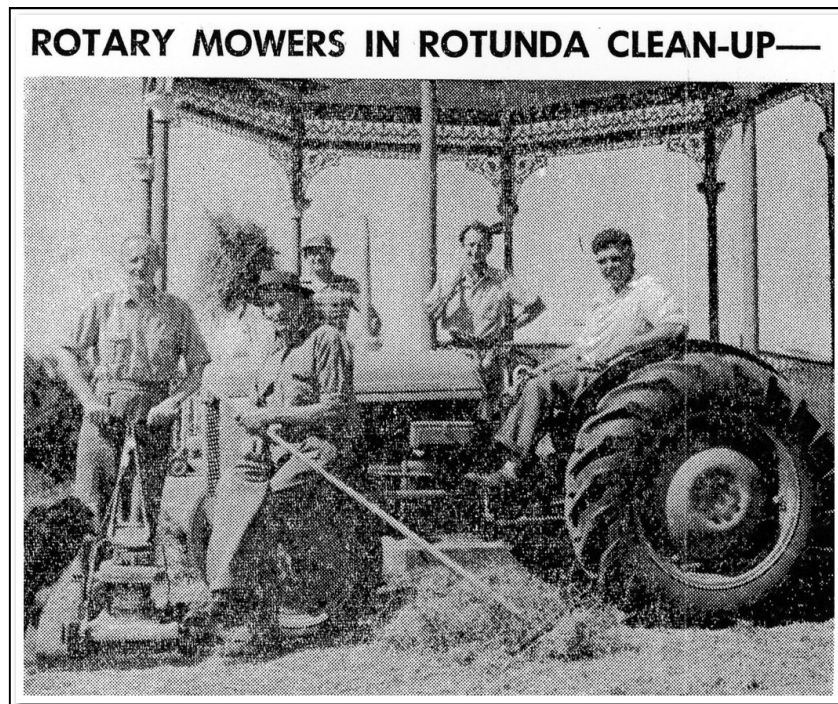


## ROTARY YEAR 1962-63 President Bob Taylor
