Dinner Meeting June 8th: Pastor Arthur Tzanakis (Nita and children Stephen and Helen)

-the Tzanakis family is leaving Millicent and moving to the Copper Triangle after Arthur has worked for 4 years in the Millicent Baptist Ministry and District's Industrial Chaplaincy

-Arthur's early employment was in his family Chicken Shop in Semaphore where he experienced his attraction to Christ's Gospel in 1993 and later commenced 4 years theological study from 1998.

-as a theological student he earned income by driving taxis and first visited Millicent with a \$530+ taxi fare from Flinders Medical Centre including Male patient 'with drip' and his supportive Wife; coffee at Salt Creek!

-early ministry was with Westcare in Adelaide CBD

-in 2006 Arthur went to Pt Pirie for three and a half years

-2009 went to Cambodia for 4 weeks familiarisation and returned in mid-2010 where he Ministered with the organisation Global Interaction

-In 2012 Arthur met Nita in Cambodia and were married in Australia January 6th 2013

-October 2013 the Tzanakis moved to Millicent where Arthur worked 3 days remuneration from Millicent Baptist church and 2 days from Industrial Chaplaincy.

-Arthur emphasised the nature of Community in Millicent and Districts which has been particularly evident at times of sad personal loss

-the Farewell for the Tzanakis at the end of May was very moving for them.

-Arthur and Nita have appreciated the community support of their neighbours, Max and Dot Blacketer; football loyalty was the only issue of dispute.

-Questions of Arthur included Semaphore, Cambodia and Chaplaincy in a non-churched context. Arthur stressed that Chaplaincy is about relationships and care which he suggested was his primary calling to Community Ministry.
